



NURTURING YOUTHFUL HUMANISM THE EXHIBITION CREATED TO MARK POPE FRANCIS' VISIT TO BOLOGNA

200 treasures of children's publishing from all over the world about equality, rights, freedom, sustainability, love and life

At a time in history in which we are beginning to feel the urge for a "new humanism", the visit of Pope Francis to Bologna in October offered the opportunity for **BolognaFiere** and **Bologna Children's Book Fair,** to organise, in collaboration with the **Church of Bologna**, a large exhibition of children's books on the contemporary themes so often brought up by Holy Father.

Taking centre stage at the exhibition, located in the Gallery between Pavilions 21 and 22 (on the first floor), are 200 illustrated books selected by the Bologna Children's Book Fair on nine "human" themes, always brought up by Pope Francis: "joyful sobriety"; unity and dialogue; decent employment; respecting the environment; the current subject of migration, as well as the eternal issues of peace and democracy and the importance of the family, the inclusion of the disabled, and the strive for truly accessible schools and culture - themes that always play a central role in the words of the Holy Father.

The strength of BolognaFiere's effort in promoting and spreading culture for children is fully expressed in this exhibition, which gathers works from middle-eastern countries, Latin America, India, Korea, China as well as Western countries. At the heart of the scientific committee's effort to create this initiative lies a truly multicultural vision. The committee is comprised of Silvia Cocchi, Ferdinando Costa, Anna Fontana Boni, Grazia Gotti, Don Stefano Ottani, Elena Pasoli and Silvana Sola.

The exhibition has a **bilingual catalogue**, **published in English and Italian**. The catalogue traces the bibliography of the selected books, ordered by subject, accompanied by words taken from speeches of Pope Francis and introduced by comments of leading international figures.
